

# Council 50 : Towards a Church Inspired by the Gospel, for the world

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## Letter n°1 May 2014

## After 50 years, help relight the flame of Vatican II!

We are faithful Catholics loyal to the message of Vatican II. Over the past 50 years, many of us calling for reforms promised at the Council have been ignored. The second Vatican Council encouraged us to speak out for the good of our Church and Pope Francis has now echoed this message in his apostolic exhortation 'Evangelii Gaudium'<sup>2</sup>

Now is the time for the hidden part of the Church to emerge from the catacombs - Join us for this once in a lifetime meeting of reform groups and leading Catholic scholars from all over the world.

As equal disciples of Jesus, we are called to show the world and the Church that the seeds planted by the second Vatican Council have produced new growth over the past 50 years. We want to hear about our experiences of keeping the Church alive as inspired by the spirit of Vatican II, what our vision is for its future, and how local groups are living and expressing faith today within an evolving world. Our diversity will show the richness and vitality of the people of God in its unity (*I cor 12*), as in the different colors of a rainbow

Reform groups, associations and movements, grass-root communities, and interested associations, are organizing throughout the world **local events** to celebrate the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the close of Vatican II that opened new ways of being Church. Remembering how the apostles and disciples of Jesus came together (*Acts 15, 2-4*), we are inviting delegates of these movements inspired by Council Vatican II to meet **together in a worldwide event in Rome** on the 20<sup>th</sup> -22<sup>nd</sup> of November 2015, in order to celebrate the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the close of Vatican II, to know each other and to exchange our local experiences and reflections.

## We are therefore invited to the following activities and actions:

## **ACTIVITIES PHASE I**

## **During Local events,**

Might be addressed, among others, questions such as:

- What are the key questions that, as the People of God, we are facing nowadays?
- How the ideas and spirit of Vatican II have been kept alive? How we envision the implementation of the spirit of Vatican II in our Church its organization and place in the world –taking into account the new context open by the new bishop of Rome?
  - Why and how we are still engaged and involved in our Church and in our world?
- What the Gospel tells us about how to live and express faith today in a world that takes more care of money than of the well-being of men and women and of the protection of nature?
  - How are we developing awareness and networks of reform and progressive groups?
  - How are we seeking opportunities for dialogue within the Church?
- Are the People of God restricted to the Catholic Church? How we foresee its future? How we envisage our relationships with the other Christian churches, and with the different religions and schools of thoughts?

**Action :** Thoughts, actions, proposals, testimonies, etc. resulting from these local events should be collected by delegates from each region, country, group in any format – e.g. posters/letters/videos/etc.- in order

- to be presented in the worldwide event in Rome,
- to be the basis of reflections and proposals to be finalized in Rome and addressed to the Christian people and to the hierarchy of our Church (see below).

Draft reports on your experiences, reflections, suggestions and activities undertaken at the local levels and identifying key priorities should be submitted to us by 30<sup>th</sup> of September 2015, in order to facilitate the organization of the worldwide event. They

# **Worldwide Event: Rome (20<sup>th</sup>- 22<sup>nd</sup> November, 2015)**



This event is planned to coincide with the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of 'the pact of the Catacombs'<sup>3</sup> and comes just before the official celebration of the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the close of Vatican II.

Broadcasts via internet are being considered.

## We will gather in Rome, as equals, seeking

- to declare our vision of a 'future for the People of God' and its commitment, inspired by the Gospel, for a world of peace founded on justice and solidarity;
- to promote change and development within the Church, and in its interaction with the world;

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup>On November 16, 1965, just days before the close of the Council, about 40 conciliar fathers celebrated a Mass in the Catacombs of St. Domitilla. - to prepare reflections and proposals to be forwarded to the Christian people and to the hierarchy of our Church during the official celebration of the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the close of Vatican II:
- to know each other with our diversity within our unity of disciples of Christ.

## **Participants**

- Approximately 100-150 delegates from different regions (possibly even more depending on the responses received and financial support)
- Individuals either in an association or not are welcome to join
- Representatives from other Christian Churches and the other religions and faith groups in sympathy with our objectives are also invited to join

## **Proposed Format**

Friday afternoon: Available for the different groups to hold meetings.

<u>Friday evening</u>: Activities for all participants;

<u>Saturday morning</u>: Plenary assembly: introductory keynote talk based on feedback gathered from local groups and associations; interviews with panels of delegates;

Saturday afternoon: Presentation of the activities of different groups and associations.

- Exhibition stands for each group to present their ideas, experiences, activities, publications, thoughts for the future, etc.
- Presentations of short videos made in local events before the gathering
- A "speakers corner" with short talks on reform

Saturday evening: Group event in Rome

<u>Sunday morning</u>: Celebration with active participation - each continent or region is invited to prepare a contribution to the celebration. We will close our conference with a public event – details to be confirmed.

## **ACTIVITY PHASE II**

A statement will be compiled after the event to be presented to the Christian people and to the hierarchy of our Church and at a press conference in Rome in December 2015.
